

Delhi City tour 25th September'2010

0800 hrs: Departure resort for Delhi (75 kms / 2 hours drive)

0900 hrs: Arrive in JNU for group photograph

1000 hrs: Arrive at Swaminarayan Akshardham.



The complex was inaugurated on 6 November, 2005. Akshardham means the eternal, divine abode of the supreme God, the abode of eternal values and virtues of Akshar as defined in the Vedas and Upanishads where divine bhakti, purity and peace forever pervades.

Swaminarayan Akshardham reflects the essence and magnitude of India's ancient architecture, traditions and timeless spirituality.

1130 hrs: Drive to city centre to visit The India Gate and Parliament house.



India gate is the national monument of India. Situated in the heart of New Delhi, India Gate was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens. Originally known as All India War Memorial, it is a prominent landmark in Delhi and commemorates the 90,000 soldiers of the British Indian Army who lost their lives while fighting for the British Indian Empire, it is composed of red sand stone and granite.



Parliament House of Delhi, commonly known as the Sansad Bhawan is a circular structure designed by Herbert Baker and was opened in 1927. The huge structure of the Parliament House has 247 pillars with broad corridor. It is the Legislative Assembly of the country. The dome of the Delhi Parliament House of India is 27.4 meters high. The Parliament House is spread over 2.02 hectares. The Parliament House has a central library whose working hours are from 10 am to 6 pm.

1300 hrs: Lunch at hotel Siddharth, Rajendra Place, New Delhi

1430 hrs: Drive to Lotus temple.



The Bahá'í House of Worship in Delhi, India, popularly known as the Lotus Temple due to its flowerlike shape, is a Bahá'í House of Worship and also a prominent attraction in Delhi. It was completed in 1986 and serves as the Mother Temple of the Indian subcontinent. It has won numerous architectural awards and been featured in hundreds of newspaper and magazine articles

1600 hrs: Drive to visit Qutab Minar, the tallest tower in India.



The minaret is 234 feet high and the highest individual tower in the world. Other towers in the world are the Great Pagoda in Peking, China and the Leaning Tower of Pisa in Italy but these towers are not as high as the Qutab Minar in Delhi. The minar was completed in 1200 A.D and since then the tall structure has been there upright and ever beautiful keeping an eye to Delhi just like a sentry.

1730 hrs: Drive back to resort.

2000 hrs: Dinner at resort
