

**Pandit Hriday Nath Kunzru Memorial Lectures** is the flagship programme of the **School of International Studies**, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU). It commemorates the life and work of Pandit Hriday Nath Kunzru - a leading freedom fighter in India's struggle for independence. He was a member of the Constituent Assembly of India, States Reorganisation Commission, Chairperson of the University Grants Commission and President of the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA). He, along with Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru, was the leading spirit behind the establishment of the Indian School of International Studies (ISIS) at ICWA in 1955 as the pioneering institute for the systematic study of international relations. Prof. A Appadorai was appointed as its first Director.

Initially ISIS was affiliated to the University of Delhi. In September 1961 it was designated as a deemed university. After the establishment of the Jawaharlal Nehru University in 1969, ISIS was merged with JNU in June 1970 as one of its schools. It was rechristened as the **School of International Studies**, popularly known as **SIS**.

**SIS**, as one of the oldest schools of JNU, is known for advanced research and learning in international relations. The School has made pioneering contributions in promoting the study of international relations as an academic discipline and in advancing knowledge and understanding of international affairs in an inter-disciplinary framework. It is the first institution of its kind in India to promote Area Studies and has developed expertise on various countries and regions of the world.

**Pandit Hriday Nath Kunzru Memorial Lectures** is a part of the School's effort to reach out to the wider community and enhance the knowledge base by providing a platform for debating important issues in world politics.
