

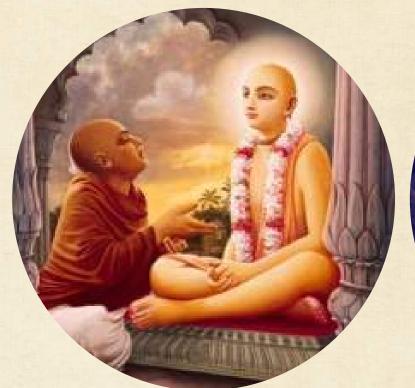

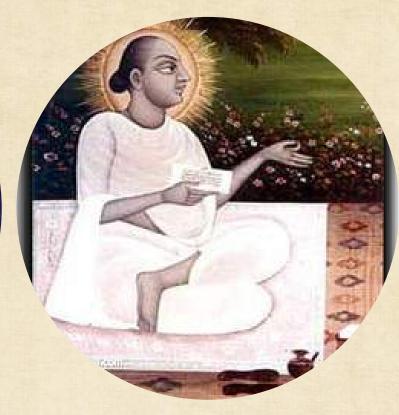

# THIS IS A HYBRID CONFERENCE

### **GUIDELINES FOR WRITING PAPERS/ABSTRACTS:**

Here are a few guidelines that enable us in compiling souvenirs and proceedings in a much easier way.

- Mention your name, designation, affiliation, contact no. and email address on your abstract and on paper.
- Abstract and paper filenames should only have the author's name, e.g., Jyotsna Mishra (without Dr./Prof./Ms./Mr. and the title of the paper).
- Please submit the abstract and paper in .docx format
- For English use the font "Times New Roman" with a single space. Keep the title's font size 14, and the running matter of abstract and paper in 12, For Devanagari use Unicode font with single space. Keep the font size of the title at 16 and the running matter point at 14. If possible, use diacritical markings (on paper).
- Abstracts may be in a maximum of 300 words.
- The maximum word limit for papers is 5000 words.
- For references in the abstract write full Rigveda, Atharvaveda (No abbreviations are required). In numbers, follow –Rigveda 1.1.1 (use dot instead of /).
- For references in the paper follow ➤ Instead of footnotes write endnotes ➤ Use abbreviations in endnotes ➤ Write Ibid./ वही, if same as a previous line in endnotes ➤ Format for secondary books in endnotes author name, book name, publisher name, place and year of publication, Volume (if any), page no. Few examples Keith and Macdonell, Vedic Index, MLBD, Delhi, 2007 (reprint), Vol. I, p. 54 / vavaśveśvaranātha, ṛgveda para eka evihāvikadṛ vi, nāgaprakāśaka, vadallī, 1967, pṛ. 200.
