<u>Course Objectives</u>: As an instrumentality of inter-state conduct, International Law or 'Law of Nations' provides an organic framework of principles, rules and institutional structure to regulate state behavior. It provides, among others, a basis for the 'outlawry' of war, pacific settlement of international disputes, prohibition of threat or use of force, other specific challenges such as nuclear weapons, disarmament and terrorism as well as rules on humanizing warfare and fixing international criminal responsibility. Within the limits of time and space, the course seeks to provide basic understanding about the role played by international legal frameworks for the regulation of conflicts and other contemporary challenges (such as terrorism and proliferation of weapons of mass destruction) and related issues.

**Learning Outcomes:** To impart an understanding as regards 'taming the beast' in the human mind that threatens international peace and security as well as to realize that those who violate International Law can be made accountable. It underscores as to how International Law works effectively within the limits of state-centric international system.
